<b>Knowledge (What do we want the children to retain?)</b>	Children will know that:  *Different teeth do different jobs *The molars chew food *Incisors tear food *Canines bite food *We have to look after our teeth by brushing them twice a day *We visit the dentist who makes sure our teeth are healthy *Our baby teeth fall out and are replaced by adult teeth	Children will know that:  *Travel means moving one from one place to another *You can travel by train. *Travel means carrying people or goods from one place to another *Trains can run via steam, diesel, electric. *A steam engine uses steam from boiling water to make it move. The steam pushes the moving parts. *Combustion means burning. A petrol engine burns petrol to make it move.	Children will know that:  *A pirate is a sailor who attacks other ships at sea and steals their property. *Piracy is an act of attacking and robbing ships at sea. *A cutlass is a short sword with a slightly curved blade used by pirates. *Booty is treasure (like money or jewels) stolen by pirates. *A sloop is a type of ship that moved very quickly and easily. It was perfect for chasing another ship to steal from them. * <b>Black Beard</b> was an English pirate who sailed around the West Indies and North America. He became a renowned pirate. He got his nickname because of his thick black beard. *Pirate Code is a list of rules that pirates followed. It would include how stolen treasure would be shared between crew members.		Children will know that:  *There are 5 oceans; Pacific, Artic, Atlantic, Indian and Southern Oceans. *The Pacific Ocean is the largest in the world. *Fish live and breathe under water. *Fish have scaly skin and breathe through gills. *Fish have fins to help them swim.	Children will know that:  *The seaside is a place by the sea that is usually a beach area or holiday resort. *The land along the coast is called the coastline. *An island is an area of land surrounded by water. *A town is a built-up area that is larger than a village but smaller than a city e.g.: Filey is a seaside town. *A map is a diagram that shows the location of continents, countries, cities, roads and specific features in relation to one another. *A key on a map explains the symbols, numbers and colours that are used on a map. *Pictures (symbols) used on a map to represent specific types of places e.g. churches, etc *Filey is a seaside town on the East coast. *The sea can be dangerous. *A lifeguards job is to look after swimming areas, help swimmers to stay safe and carry out rescues in emergencies
